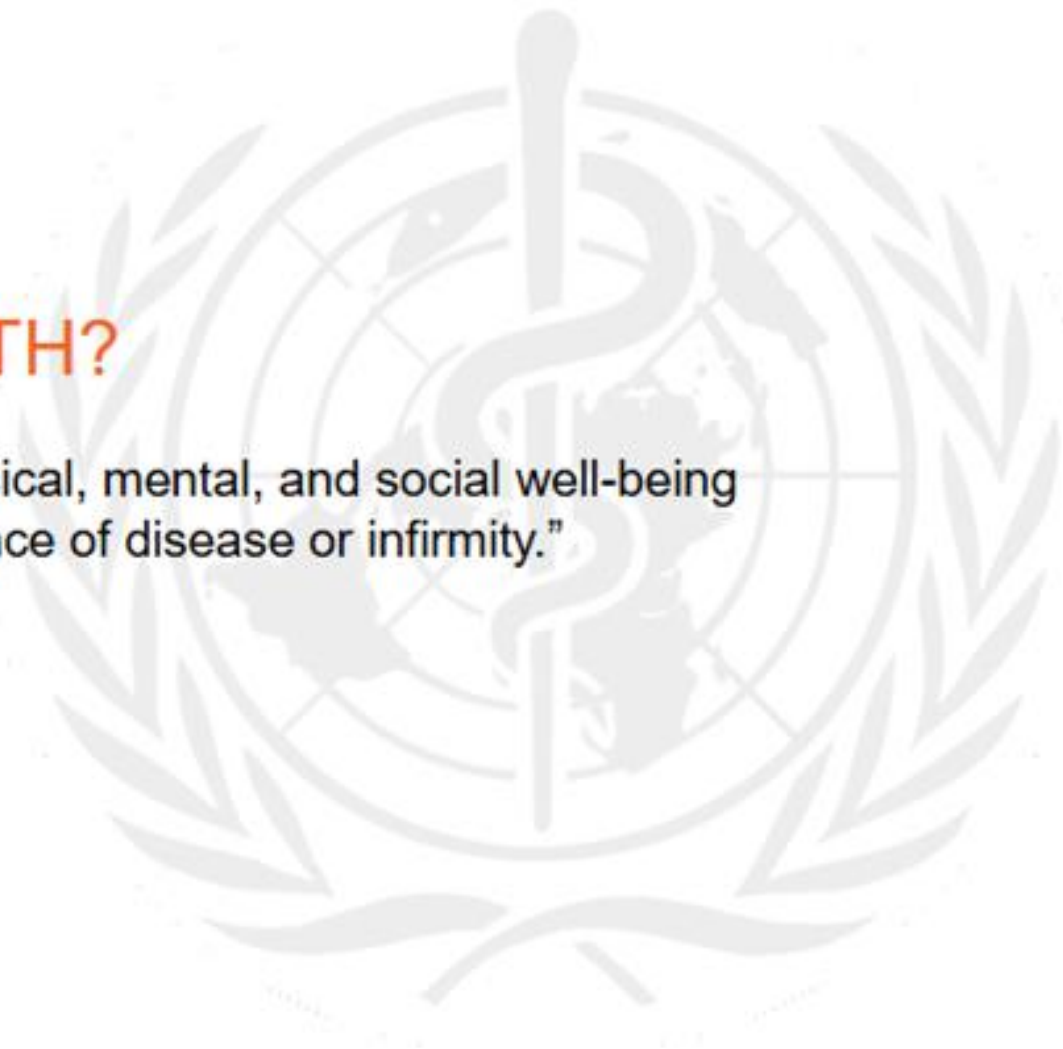

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Flex Fund

Why It Was Created

- 2024 was the first Flex Fund grant cycle
- Impact Alamance applied and received funding from Honda Corporation to offer general operations to nonprofits in Alamance
- Our grantee perception survey - Nonprofits desire general operation funding
- The cycle will be offered in 2026, unsure about future funding





Flex Fund

- Competitive grant opportunity up to \$7,500
- Grant awards are for nonprofit general operation expenses and not program expenses
- Must address one or more of the social drivers of health as identified in the 2024 Alamance County Community Health Assessment

Examples of General Operation Expenses

- Staff salaries and benefits
- Rent and utilities
- Office supplies and equipment
- Technology costs
- Marketing and communications
- Fundraising costs
- Accounting and legal fees
- Insurance
- Professional development



Amount Awarded

- Up to \$5,000 for new nonprofits that:
 - Have not previously received a grant from Impact Alamance OR
 - Do not have a full-time executive director
- Up to \$7,500 for nonprofits that:
 - Have received grant funding from Impact Alamance and have a paid, full-time executive director on staff OR
 - Have participated and graduated from Leadership Institute, Teacher Leadership Academy, or Alamance County Racial Equity Collaborative and have a paid executive director on staff



Flex Fund Eligibility

- 501 (c)(3) nonprofit must be in Alamance County, serving Alamance County residents
- Must have 501 (c)(3) status for 2 years
- Must address community health through one or more of the social drivers of health
- Priority will be given to those that have not received a Progress and Enhancement or Flex Fund grant in the past year



Not Eligible

- Government entities
- Sports teams
- Individuals
- Political organizations or campaigns
- For-profit entities
- Capital Campaigns
- Programs promoting religious doctrine
- Event sponsorships
- Scholarships





Flex Fund Priority

Priority will be given to organizations that:

- Have a proven track record of service and collaboration with other organizations in Alamance County.
- Gains feedback and engages the community the organization serves
- Serve a large amount of people
- Serve a diverse population
- Provide a financial statement demonstrating revenue and expenses over two years

Thursday, August 27th	Letter of Intent Opens
Thursday, September 10th	Letters of Intent Due by 5pm
Wednesday, September 16th	Organizations Notified on Application Status
Wednesday, October 7th	Grant Applications Due by 5pm
Thursday, November 5th	Recommendations Presented to Impact Alamance Board
Friday, November 6th	Organizations Notified of Funding Status

Purpose of Letter of Intent

- Internal staff review eligibility (nonprofits status, year nonprofit established, located in Alamance, recent funding)
- Determine who is invited to apply to submit a full application and for what amount (\$5000 or \$7,500) based on criteria
- Letter of intent is a brief form mainly multiple-choice questions and two short answers
